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BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF WORK

1. ABOUT GAIN

The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) is a Swiss-based foundation launched at the UN in 2002 to tackle the human suffering caused by malnutrition. Working with both governments and businesses, we aim to transform food systems so that they deliver more nutritious food for all people. At GAIN, we believe that everyone in the world should have access to nutritious and safe food. We work to understand and deliver specific solutions to the daily challenge of food insecurity faced by poor people. By understanding that there is no “one-size-fits-all” model, we develop alliances and build tailored programmes, using a variety of flexible models and approaches. We build alliances between governments, local and global businesses, and civil society to deliver sustainable improvements at scale. We are part of a global network of partners working together to create sustainable solutions to malnutrition. Through alliances, we provide technical, financial, and policy support to key participants in the food system. We use specific learning, evidence of impact, and results of projects and programmes to shape and influence the actions of others. Headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, GAIN has representative offices in Denmark, The Netherlands, the United Kingdom, and the United States. In addition, we have country offices in Bangladesh, Ethiopia, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Mozambique, Nigeria, Pakistan, and Tanzania. Programmes and projects are carried out in a variety of other countries, particularly in Africa and Asia.

2. Background

In a non-governmental organization (NGO) like GAIN, reliable and secure internet connectivity is crucial for the smooth execution of daily operations, communication, and program implementation. The need for an efficient Internet Service Provider (ISP) stems from the organization's reliance on digital platforms for coordinating activities, managing remote teams, ensuring timely communication with stakeholders, and accessing vital information resources. Additionally, as GAIN often operate in diverse and sometimes challenging environments, a dependable ISP ensures uninterrupted service delivery, enabling the organization to meet its mission and objectives effectively. Engaging a capable ISP is therefore essential to support the organization's technological infrastructure, enhance productivity, and maintain seamless connectivity across all GAIN operations.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this RFP is to identify and select an Internet Service Provider (ISP) that can provide high-speed, reliable Internet services to The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN). The selected ISP will be responsible for ensuring optimal internet connectivity, with minimal downtime and prompt customer support.

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4. Scope of Work

The scope of work for this proposal and the engagement of the successful service provider are as follows:

- Service Locations: Abuja
- Type of Service: Specify if you need Fiber (because we have other technologies like DSL, wireless, satellite, etc)
- Service Installation: Installation of all necessary equipment and infrastructure.
- Technical Support: 24/7 technical support with defined response times.
- Network Monitoring and Reporting: Availability of real-time monitoring (web-based portal), reporting tools, and notifications informing on outages or performance issues.
- Internet Connectivity: minimum 35 Mbps download/upload speed
- Service Availability: Information on your service coverage in our area (Patrick O. Bokkor Crescent, Jabi) including details on downtime statistics and average latency. The monthly minimum service availability is expected to be 99.9%
- Service Level Agreement (SLA): Commitment to uptime guarantees, latency, packet loss, and jitter requirements.
- Scalability: Ability to upgrade bandwidth and services as needed.

5. Proposal Requirements

Proposals must include the following information:

- Company Profile: Overview of the company, including years in business, experience in providing internet services, and references from similar organizations.
- Regulatory Compliance: Complies with data protection laws and regulations.
- Insurance and Liability – The internet service provider liability coverage in case of outages or data breaches.
- Technical (Service) Proposal: Detailed description of the proposed solution, including equipment, Information on bandwidth options, upload/download speeds, and data caps (if any), redundancy, Description of the installation process, including timeframes and any other technical aspects.
- Financial Proposal: Detailed cost breakdown, including installation fees, monthly fees, any additional charges, and payment terms.
- Service Level Agreement (SLA): Proposed SLA terms, including uptime guarantees, response times, and compensation for service interruptions.
- Implementation Plan: Timeline for service installation and any necessary infrastructure upgrades.
- Support and Maintenance: Details about customer support, maintenance schedules, and contact points for issue resolution.

6. Evaluation Criteria:

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Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Technical Capability: Ability to meet or exceed the technical requirements.
- Cost-Effectiveness: Competitive pricing and overall value for money.
- Experience and References: Proven track record of delivering similar services.
- Customer Support: Quality of customer support and responsiveness.
- SLA Terms: Favorable SLA terms that align with our needs.

7. Submission Guidelines

- **Proposal Submission Deadline:** October 22nd, 2024

All proposals must be submitted by 23:55 PM on the due date. Late submissions will not be considered.

The following requirements must be met by the prospective service provider:

- a. Provide a detailed company profile and evidence of business registration.
- b. Respond to this RFP by providing information on:
 - i. The Internet Service Provider firm must currently be registered under the Nigerian Communication Commission (NCC) and possess the technical capacity and the capability to express their interest (EOI)
 - ii. A list of the organizational IT personnel and the proof of membership it belongs to.
 - iii. Provide 2 reference letters from a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) or corporate private firm.
 - iv. Submission of audited financial statement with evidence of tax remittances
 - v. Insurance certificates (Public Liability Insurance & Workers Compensation insurance)

8. Scoring

Elements of the proposal will be weighted equally based on:

- Clear articulation and understanding of the task.
- Competency and track record in offering similar services to other organizations.
- Technical competence and demonstrated ability of team.
- Cost-effectiveness/competitive status.

9. Implementation Arrangements Input Provided by the Authority

The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN), Nigeria will work closely with the successful consultant/firm to achieve the objectives of this consultancy. The engagement will be managed by the Head of Operations, GAIN Nigeria. The successful bidder will work in close collaboration with the Operations Team. The Internet Service Provider firm or individual is also expected to hold with high regard, integrity, objectivity, independence, professional competence, due care, confidentiality, professional behaviour, and technical standards.

FEE PROPOSAL

- a. The Internet Service Provider firm is required to submit its fee proposal for this proposed project.
- b. A detail pricing schedule is required for the duration of 2 (two) years.

EXTENT OF WORK AND LIMITATIONS

All work described in this Terms of Reference (TOR) requires the Internet Service Provider firm to express its interest by submitting their proposal. Any proposal outside of the TOR will not be considered.

Qualifications

The Service Provider shall be a demonstrably experienced internet service provider. Must also have verifiable evidence of previous work with international development agencies in Nigeria focusing on broadband Internet service provisions across Nigeria like GAIN. In addition, the Service Provider should have a minimum of (10) years of working experience with professionally competent staff knowledgeable in the various phases of the provision of internet services.

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2. SUBMISSION

3. UNACCEPTABLE

The following proposals will automatically not be considered or accepted:

- Proposals that are received after the RFP deadline.
- Proposals received by fax.
- Incomplete proposals.
- Proposals that are not signed.

4. ACCEPTANCE

GAIN will not necessarily accept the lowest cost of any of the Proposals submitted. Accordingly, eligibility requirements, evaluation criteria and mandatory requirements shall govern the process.

5. COMPLETION

- In case of errors in calculating overall costs, the unit costs will govern the process.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to understand the requirements and instructions specified by GAIN. If clarification is necessary, applicants are advised to contact the responsible persons at GAIN under section II. point 1., prior to making their submission.

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evidence of qualifications as it may deem necessary, and will consider evidence concerning the financial, technical, and other qualifications and abilities of the applicant.

After awarding the Proposal and upon written request to GAIN, only the following information will be released:

- Name of the successful applicant.
- The applicant's own individual ranking.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS SOLICITATION

1. NOTICE OF NON-BINDING SOLICITATION

GAIN reserves the right to reject any and all bids received in response to this solicitation and is in no way bound to accept any proposal. GAIN additionally reserves the right to negotiate the substance of the successful applicants' proposals, as well as the option of accepting partial components of a proposal if deemed appropriate.

2. CONFIDENTIALITY

All information provided as part of this solicitation is considered confidential. In the event that any information is inappropriately released, GAIN will seek appropriate remedies as allowed. Proposals, discussions, and all information received in response to this solicitation will be held as strictly confidential.

3. RIGHT TO FINAL NEGOTIATIONS ON THE PROPOSAL

GAIN reserves the right to negotiate on the final costs, and the final scope of work of the proposal. GAIN reserves the right to limit or include third parties at GAIN's sole and full discretion in such negotiations.

4. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Proposals will be reviewed by the Selection Team. The following indicate a list of the significant criteria against which proposals will be assessed. This list is not exhaustive or 100% inclusive and is provided to enhance the applicants' ability to respond with substance.

Applicants are required to submit the following information, conforming to the guidelines given in this section:

- Understanding of the scope of work:
- The proposal shall demonstrate a clear understanding of the project objective and deliverables as outlined in Section I.
- Demonstrate a clear understanding of the technical requirements of this RFP:

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- Providing detailed technical documentation of the proposed strategy.
- Evidence of experience delivering solutions using the proposed information technology platform.
- Relevant certification by recognized institutions.

The creative and methodological approaches required to implement each of the parts of the scope of work.

Comprehensiveness of work plan and reasonableness of proposed time frame:

- The proposal shall include a feasible work plan to ensure the successful completion of deliverables.
- The work plan details how activities will be coordinated.

Detailed budget and cost-effectiveness of the proposed approach:

- Evidence of cost-effective approaches to undertaking the scope of work within the proposed budget.
- The proposal shall identify possible challenges and include creative approaches to addressing them.

Management and personnel plan:

- The team members working on this project shall have the relevant qualifications and overall experience required to successfully implement the project.
- Roles and responsibilities of each team member shall be clearly defined.
- GAIN shall have one main contact person clearly identified in the proposal.
- A duly completed offer of services.

GAIN reserves the right to contact the individuals and contractor(s) to verify the information provided as part of the Proposal.

5. REVIEW PROCESS

The review process will involve a Review Panel with participants selected by GAIN.

6. LIMITATIONS WITH REGARD TO THIRD PARTIES

GAIN does not represent, warrant, or act as an agent for any third party as a result of this solicitation. This solicitation does not authorize any third party to bind or commit GAIN in any way without GAIN's express written consent.

7. COMMUNICATION

All communication regarding this solicitation shall be directed to appropriate parties at GAIN. Contacting third parties involved in the RFP, the review panel, or any other party may be considered a conflict of

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interest and could result in disqualification of the proposal.

8. FINAL ACCEPTANCE

Award of a Proposal does not imply acceptance of its terms and conditions. GAIN reserves the right to negotiate on the final terms and conditions including the costs and the scope of work when negotiating the final contract to be agreed between GAIN and the applicant.

9. VALIDITY PERIOD

The offer of services will remain valid for a period of 60 days after the Proposal closing date. In the event of an award, the successful applicant will be expected to enter into a contract subject to GAIN's terms and conditions.

10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Subject to the terms of the contract to be concluded between GAIN and the applicant, the ownership of the intellectual property related to the scope of work of the contract, including technical information, know-how, processes, copyrights, models, drawings, source code and specifications developed by the applicant in performance of the contract shall vest entirely with GAIN.

11. SCOPE OF CHANGE

Once the contract is signed, no increase in the liability of GAIN or in the fees to be paid by GAIN for the services resulting from any change, modification or interpretation of the documents will be authorized or paid to the applicant unless such change, modification or interpretation has received the express prior written approval of GAIN.
