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I. PROJECT BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF WORK

1. ABOUT GAIN

The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) is a Swiss-based foundation launched at the UN in 2002 to tackle the human suffering caused by malnutrition. Working with both governments and businesses, we aim to transform food systems so that they deliver more nutritious food for all people.

GAIN's work to improve the consumption of safe and nutritious food is based on three interlinked strategic objectives:

- 1. to improve the demand for safe, nutritious foods,
- 2. to increase the availability of nutritious foods and enhance the nutritional value of foods, and
- 3. to strengthen the enabling environment to improve the consumption of safe, nutritious foods

We build alliances between governments, local and global businesses, and civil society to deliver sustainable improvements at scale. We are part of a global network of partners working together to create sustainable solutions to malnutrition. Through alliances, we provide technical, financial and policy support to key participants in the food system. We use specific learning, evidence of impact, and results of projects and programmes to shape and influence the actions of others.

Headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland, GAIN has representative offices in Denmark, The Netherlands, the United Kingdom, and the United States. In addition, we have country offices in Bangladesh, Benin, Ethiopia, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Mozambique, Nigeria, Pakistan, Tanzania and Uganda. Programmes and projects are carried out in a variety of other countries, particularly in Africa and Asia.

2. BACKGROUND

Food Action Cities (www.foodactioncities.org) is a website platform aimed at informing and inspiring cities in their efforts to shape food systems in ways that advance nutrition and facilitate locally led, best practice sustainable development. The website, co-developed by GAIN, Milan Urban Food Policy Pact and RUAF in 2021, is primarily an information website, written in English, and supported by search functionalities. Google translate supports other languages. This website is designed to be viewed on old and new mobile phone platforms as well as desktops and laptops.

Information content covers topical highlight articles and a growing number of short and long case studies, structured around seven main thematic areas and several cross cutting themes. Content also comprises a few videos and podcasts, numerous photographs as well as external links to other websites and additional reference documents. Google analytics and a hotspot user report is used to monitor and evaluate website functionality and use. Editorial, submission forms, backend uploads of content and tagging are managed by GAIN and other co-hosts.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The purpose of this RFP is to engage a competent, reliable, and established provider to host and maintain the Food Action Cities web platform (currently designed on WordPress) – www.foodactioncities.org - including essential updates and any other related services, between January 2025 – December 2027. This



support must ensure that the website remains functional, secure, and meets evolving user needs while supporting the goals of the platform, best practices and GAIN's duty of care principle.

3.1 TASKS AND DELIVERABLES

Between contracted date in January/February 2025 and 31 December 2027, the successful provider shall deliver, without interruption, unless for pre-agreed upon brief time lapses for maintenance and updates:

1. Website Hosting and Maintenance

- Reliable, best practice hosting of website with performance monitoring with regular monitoring to ensure optimal performance, uptime, and speed.
- Security Updates: Monthly updates for WordPress core, plugins, and themes to address vulnerabilities.
- Bug Fixes: Resolution of technical issues reported by users or identified during audits.
- Backup Management: Implement and maintain a reliable backup solution with periodic testing of backups.
- SEO Optimization: Ensure the website adheres to SEO best practices, including regular audits and technical updates to improve search engine rankings.
- Support functionality of google analytics and other website user analytics (GAIN will manage reporting).

2. Light Development for New Features

- Feature Development: Implement minor enhancements such as new page templates, interactive widgets, or small-scale integrations with third-party services.
- Scalability: Ensure all developments align with long-term scalability and technological adaptability.

3. Content Support

- Provide minor content updates and editing support as requested.
- Ensure the site complies with accessibility guidelines and maintains SEO best practices.
